A RRERE MHSTORY OR TETE KNOXVILLE SYMPEONY CEAGUE

In 1952 eleven charter members formed the Knoxville Symphony Guild to further the financial support of the Orchestra. Guild activities included social functions such as coffees, luncheons, and silver teas; cultural events, including music appreciation courses; the operation of educational concerts, attended yearly by thousands of students from the area; and the giving of musical scholarships for deserving young students.

Because of the commitment of Guild members and the support of the community, fundraising projects enabled the Women's Guild to contribute substantially to the maintenance fund of the Knoxville Symphony Orchestra and Youth Orchestra, the latter of which the Guild founded in 1974, with the guidance of Dr: and Mrs. James H. Marable. In 1980, the Women's Guild of the Knoxville Symphony Society changed its name to "Knoxville Symphony League."

In 1984, money raised during the World's Fair Show House was placed in an endowment fund for the Knoxville Symphony Orchestra. In 2007 this fund reached one million dollars. The interest from this fund is available to the Knoxville Symphony Orchestra to use for operating expenses while the principal remains untouched.

Various types of fundraising events have been successfully undertaken through the years: balls, benefit dinner parties, auctions, fashion shows, show houses, and a community events calendar.

Membership in the Knoxville Symphony League is open to any person interested in supporting the Knoxville Symphony Orchestra by promoting season ticket sales and by raising funds to assist the Knoxville Symphony Society in its goal to maintain a balanced budget for the Orchestra. The entire membership is encouraged to participate in these important activities.

# BX-LAWS OF <br> THE KNOXVILLE SYMPHONY LEAGUE 

## ARTICLE I - NAME

Section 1: Name: The name of the organization shall be "The Knoxville Symphony League."

## ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

Section 1: Purpose: The purpose of this organization shall be to support, encourage, and promote the growth and development of the Knoxville Symphony Orchestra; to assist in its activities; to work for the expansion of interest and support for the orchestra while providing the members of the League with activities and projects which will be of personal value and enjoyment.

Section 2: The League shall work under the direction of and upon recommendation from the Board of Directors of the Knoxville Symphony Society, but the League shall exercise administrative control over its own organization, activities, and funds.

## ARTICLE III - RELATIONSHIP

Section 1: Through its President and other officers, the League shall work in harmony and close cooperation with the Board of Directors of the Knoxville Symphony Society, but membership in one organization shall not automatically entitle one to membership in the other.

Section 2: The President, President-Elect and Executive Vice President of the League shall be members of the Executive Committee of the Knoxville Symphony Society by virtue of their office, but no responsibilities of budget, support, or other activities involving the League shall be delegated by the Society to the League or accepted by the League without the approval of the President and Board of Directors of the League.

1. Board Members:
a. Evaluate Board Members and recommend either a termination of service or an invitation to be nominated for a new three-year term.
b. Invite recommendations for the Board from Board members. Nominate sufficient names for the Board to fill vacancies and check with same for permission to nominate.
c. Present in writing the slate of new Board members for election at the annual meeting.
2. League Officers:
a. Select a slate of nominees for all elected offices and contact same for permission to nominate.
b. Present in writing the slate of nominees for election at the annual meeting.
3. Honorary Board Members:

Select a Board member or members to be honored as Honorary Board Member(s) and announce at the annual meeting. Honorary Board members shall be listed in the Yearbook.
4. Special League Honoree of Year:

May select a business and/or individuals as Honoree(s) of the year and invite to annual meeting as guest(s) for presentation. This (these) Honoree(s) shall be listed in the Yearbook.
5. Presentation of Slate of Officers:

Section 1: As a courtesy to the Executive Committee and Board of Directors, the Nominating Committee will present the slate of officers and Board members to be considered for election.
Section 2: Nomination from the floor: Nominations may be made from the floor at the annual meeting provided the nomination is seconded by two members of the League and provided that the nominee, at the time of the meeting, consents to serve if elected.

Section 3: The Executive Director of the Orchestra and President of the Board of Directors of the Symphony Society and the President of the League shall be considered the chief liaison officers between the Board and the League.

## ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: Persons interested in the welfare of the Knoxville Symphony Orchestra shall be eligible for membership in the League upon payment of annual dues.

Section 2: The amount of the annual membership fee shall be determined by the Board of Directors and payable by May 31 of each year to assure listing in the Yearbook.

## ARTICLE V - NOMINATIONS, ELECTIONS AND INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS AND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1.A: The Nominating Committee shall consist of:

1. A Chairman selected from the previous year's Board of Directors by the Nominating Committee of the previous year. The chairman shall attend all Executive Committee meetings as a non-voting member.
2. One member elected by the Board of Directors from the Board of Directors at the first board meeting of the year.
3. One member elected by the Board of Directors from the general membership at the first board meeting of the year.
4. One member elected by the Board of Directors from the Merit Board at the first Board meeting of the year.
5. The President-Elect shall be a non-voting member.
6. The President shall be a non-voting member except in case of a tie vote.
7. The Executive Vice President shall be a non-voting member. Section 1.B: The duties of the Nominating Committee shall be:

Section 2: Other Meetings: In addition to the annual meeting, the President or Board of Directors may call other meetings to be held at such time and place as fixed by them.

## ARTICLE VIII - DIRECTORS

Section 1: Number: There shall be a Board of Directors of not less than twenty-five (25) members but said Board of Directors may enlarge its membership to a total not to exceed sixty-six (66) members in a given year.

Section 2: Duties: It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to manage the business of the League. Each director, except for Executive Committee members, shall assume the major responsibility of a chairmanship or co-chairmanship of a committee, and all directors shall be required to attend or financially support two or more of the League's fundraisers as determined by the Executive Committee.

Section 3: Meetings: The Board of Directors shall have not less than four meetings per year in addition to the meeting for the election of officers. Special meetings may be called by the President or one of the Vice Presidents or two Directors.

Section 4: Quorum: Twenty percent ( $20 \%$ ) of the authorized membership present in person shall constitute a quorum of the Board of Directors for the purpose of transacting business.

Section 5: Attendance: Each director shall attend a minimum of five Board meetings during the year. In the event that there are fewer than eight regularly scheduled meetings, each director shall attend at least half of the Board meetings except in cases of extreme illness or emergency, subject to approval by the Executive Committee at its next meeting. Any director not fulfilling these requirements will be declared automatically resigned by the Board, and the Board may fill the vacancy.

Section 3: Election of Officers: Officers and members of the Board shall be elected at an annual meeting with installation of officers to take place in May.

Section 4: Terms of office: Each member of the Board of Directors shall assume office immediately upon election for a term of three years and shall be eligible for re-election upon the expiration of his or her term. The term of one-third $(1 / 3)$ of the members shall expire in May of each year. The Nominating Committee shall present a slate consisting of one-third $(1 / 3)$ of the board for election at the annual meeting. Any vacancy in office during a term may be filled at the next meeting of the Board of Directors upon recommendation from the Nominating Committee.

Section 5: Upon recommendation of the Nominating Committee and ratification by the Board of Directors, Directors who have extended outstanding service may become Honorary Directors, continuing as voting members of the Board of Directors. Designation as an Honorary Director shall not exempt said director from payment of membership dues.

## ARTICLE VI - FISCAL YEAR

Section 1: The fiscal year of the League shall begin on the first day of June and end on the last day of May in the following year.

Section 2: The term of office of elected and appointed officials shall coincide with the fiscal year.

## ARTICLE VII - MEETINGS

Section 1: Annual Meetings: There shall be at least one annual meeting of the entire membership during the year, and other meetings shall be scheduled at the discretion of the Board and its officers. The new slate of officers and directors for the ensuing year shall be elected at a meeting of the membership and this meeting shall be considered the annual meeting.
duties as may from time to time be delegated to him or her by the Board of Directors. He or she shall consider it his or her obligation to include the President-Elect in all meetings and acquaint him or her with all League activities. He or she shall serve on the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee of the Knoxville Symphony Society.
B. PRESIDENT-ELECT: The President-Elect shall serve on the Executive Committee of the League and on the Board of Directors and Executive Committee of the Knoxville Symphony Society and shall automatically succeed the President of the League. He or she shall maintain the membership activity file and shall collect, update and distribute the "Annual Reports/Job Descriptions" to all elected and appointed officials.
C. EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT: The Executive Vice President, who shall be the immediate past President, shall serve on the Executive Committee and on the Board of Directors and Executive Committee of the Knoxville Symphony Society. In the absence of the President or during the resident's inability to function, the Executive Vice President shall perform the duties of President. The Executive Vice President shall be chairman of the Long Range Planning Committee.

Section 3: VICE PRESIDENTS: The Vice Presidents shall have such duties and powers as may be delegated to them by the President.

Section 4: RECORDING SECRETARY: The Recording Secretary shall keep the records of the League except such records as are specifically assigned to others. He or she shall keep a record of the minutes of all meetings of the League, of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee.

Section 5: ASSISTANT RECORDING SECRETARY: The Assistant Recording Secretary shall perform the duties of the Recording Secretary in his or her absence and shall maintain an attendance roll of Executive Committee and Board of Directors meetings and notify delinquent Board members.

Section 6: The Merit Board of the Knoxville Symphony League will consist of those Board members who have had nine years of service on the Knoxville Symphony League Board of Directors, not necessarily consecutive years, or past Presidents, upon their request. Application to membership on the Knoxville Symphony League Merit Board must be made by the Knoxville Symphony League Board member on or before February 1 of each year: Responsibilities of Knoxville Symphony League Merit Board are: payment of annual dues, season ticket holder, serve in an advisory position(s) as needed to the Knoxville Symphony League committee(s). There will be no attendance requirements to Knoxville Symphony League Board meetings. Merit Board Members in good standing shall be afforded the same privileges as Regular Board Members including voting privileges. In addition, Knoxville Symphony League Merit Board members will be recognized at the May luncheon, be listed separately in the yearbook and may change membership status to the Knoxville Symphony League Board of Directors on a space available basis upon written applicationtotheNominating Committee on or before February 1 of each year.

ARTICLE IX - OFFICERS
Section 1: The League shall have as officers a President, a President-Elect, and Executive Vice President, not more than eight (8) Vice Presidents, a Recording Secretary, an Assistant Recording Secretary, a Corresponding Secretary, an Assistant Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer, and a Parliamentary Advisor. Officers-elect shall work closely with elected officers during the spring League activities, and installation of new officers shall take place in May.

Section 2:
A. PRESIDENT: The President shall be the chief executive officer of the League and shall preside at all meetings of members and of the Board of Directors. He or she shall be the representative of the League and shall assume such special powers and

The accounts of theTreasurer shall be audited annually. The Treasurer shall be chairman of the Finance Committee.
Section 9: ASSISTANT TREASURER: The Assistant Teasurer shall perform the duties of the Treasurer in his or her absence or inability to act or when there is need for additional assistance. The Assistant Treasurer shall be the designated Treasurer of the Symphony Showhouse. He or she shall be cochairman of the Finance Committee.
Section 10: PARLIAMENTARY ADVISOR: The Parliamentary Advisor shall be present at all meetings with a copy of the League By-Laws and the Robert's Rules of Order. It is the responsibility of the Parliamentary Advisor to enforce said regulations in all business of the League. The Parliamentary Advisor shall be chairman of the By-Laws Committee whenever it is determined that revisions are necessary.
Section 11: MERIT ADVISOR: The Merit Advisor shall impart the knowledge and experience from years of service within the League.

## ARTICLE X - COMMITTEES

Section 1: STANDING COMMITTEES: There shall be a chairman and vice-chairman appointed by the President for each of the standing committees, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors. With the exception of the Nominating Committee (see Article V, Section 1), the committee chairmen select their committee members. The President serves as an ex-officio member of all committees.
The standing committees are:
A. COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE shall maintain a communications and distribution network among the Executive Committee, Board League members, this network to include telephoning, mailing and emailing.

Section 6: CORRESPONDING SECRETARY: The Corresponding Secretary shall send notices for all meetings of the League to the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee. Honorary Directors and Past Presidents shall be notified of the annual meeting and other meetings, as deemed advisable. The Corresponding Secretary shall send notices for any additional meetings not listed in the yearbook. The Corresponding Secretary shall also send notices to the appropriate parties of memorial contributions made to the Knoxville Symphony League. The Corresponding Secretary shall send other correspondence as directed by the President of the League.

Section 7: ASSISTANT CORRESPONDING SECRETARY: The Assistant Corresponding Secretary shall perform the duties of the Corresponding Secretary in his or her absence or during his or her disability to act and conduct all correspondence of the League, except as otherwise provided. He or she shall be responsible for keeping an up-to-date mailing list to coordinate invitations to League activities.

Section 8: TREASURER: The Treasurer shall have custody of all funds of the League and shall keep a complete and accurate record of all receipts and disbursements. The Treasurer shall supervise the bookkeeping of all committees. He or she shall deposit or shall authorize the Assistant Treasurer/President to deposit all funds in the name of the League in such depository as shall be approved by the Board of Directors. He or she shall sign all checks upon authorization of the President. If the Treasurer is unable to act, the checks shall be signed by the Assistant Treasurer with the authorization of the President. The Treasurer shall present a monthly report of receipts and disbursements and an annual accounting to the Board of Directors. This report should be presented at the annual May luncheon. In the event records are not available to make a complete report at this meeting, this information shall be presented no later than the first fall Executive and Board of Directors meeting.
I. PUBLIC RELATIONS COMMITTEE shall direct all publicity for the League and may arrange programs of special interest in Orchestra or League activities, working closely with the Executive Director of the Knoxville Symphony Society. It shall be responsible for maintaining a scrapbook of League activities and for creating a display suitable for exhibition at the May meeting and at conventions. It shall be responsible for additions to the League history in the yearbook.
J. SEASON TICKET SALES COMMITTEE shall work closely with the Executive Director and with the Director of Marketing of the Knoxville Symphony Society to plan its role in the annual sale of season tickets.
K. WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE shall be responsible for fundraising projects subject to the Board's approval and shall serve as liaison with the Knoxville Symphony Society Development Director

Section 2: AD HOC COMMITTEES may be appointed by the President of the League when necessary. The Chairmen and Co-Chairmen of Ad Hoc Committees shall hold their offices until completion of the duties of the committees.

## ARTICLE XI - AMENDMENTS

Section 1: These By-laws may be amended at any meeting of the League provided a copy of the proposed amendment(s) as approved by the Executive Committee and Board of Directors has been sent to each member with a notice of the meeting.

## ARTICLE XII - PROCEDURE

Section 1: All meetings of the League shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.
B. EDUCATION COMMITTEE shall support educational activities relating to symphonic music, such as the Young People's Concerts, the Knoxville Symphony Youth Orchestra, and the Concerto Competition. The Youth Orchestra Manager shall serve on the committee.
C. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, composed of all elected officers of the Board, shall be empowered to transact any necessary business between board meetings and shall report all action to the Board of Directors.
D. FINANCE COMMITTEE shall anticipate the financial needs of the League and shall recommend an annual budget at the first Board of Directors meeting following the annual meeting. The
Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer shall serve on the committee as Chairman and Co-Chairman.
E. HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE shall plan social events to promote interest in League activities and in the Symphony and shall work with the Knoxville Symphony Society Executive Director to welcome artists and visitors on Symphony business, if needed. F. KNOXVILLE SYMPHONY SOCIETY SUPPORT DRIVE COMMITTEE shall work closely with the Directors of the K.S.S. on the Annual Fund Drive.
G. MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE shall work closely with the President and the Vice President for Membership, promoting the general membership of the League, recruiting new members, collecting dues and maintaining records, and shall be responsible for combining all necessary materials for the yearbook, for proofreading, and for having the yearbook printed and distributed initially and throughout the year as new members join.
H. NOMINATING COMMITTEE (Refer to Article V, Section 1).
8. Each Fundraising Chairman shall have a Financial Chairman to prepare a budget for the committee and to serve as a liaison between the committee and the Treasurer. The Financial Chairman will be appointed by the Chairman of said committee.
9. All solicitation for funds or gifts for any League project must first be cleared with the office staff of the Knoxville Symphony Society.
10. All requests from League members to the K.S.S. office must be made in writing.
11. A receipt must be written for all money collected for any League function. (Exception: Show House tour tickets.)
12. Every League member who attends a League-sponsored event for which there is a charge must purchase a ticket.
13. In the event of the death of a Board member or a member of their immediate family (husband, daughter, son, mother, father, sister or brother) a donation will be made by the League to the KSL Endowment Fund in their memory. Additionally, when a Past President or Honorary Director herself dies, the League will memorialize her with a gift to the KSL Endowment Fund.
14. All League members and guests are expected to honor reservation deadlines as published and not request that exceptions that exceptions be made. All reservations are to be paid in advance.
15. The KSL Yearbook should contain a statement stipulating that the Yearbook is for the use of the KSL only.
16. The President of the KSL shall be accorded the "best table" in the house for herself and her guests for each League event where table reservations are required. The President has the option to decline such table if she so desires.
17. Due to the length of the Board meeting, before our luncheons, members of the Board will be allowed to make reservations for reserved seating at the luncheon if bringing a guest.

## poLicces

1. A member of the Board of Directors must have served one fiscal year as a member of the League before being considered eligible for the Board.
2. A nominee for the office of President-Elect must have completed a minimum of one three-year term as a member of the Board of Directors.
3. In the event that a Knoxville Symphony League volunteer elects to accept a paid position with the Knoxville Symphony Society, she may retain her membership in the KSL and her Merit Board status if a Merit Board member, provided she meets the Merit Board requirements as outlined in Article VIII, Section 6, of the KSL By-Laws. She may not retain any position as officers, chairman, or member of the Executive Board of Directors of the KSL during the duration of her employment with the Knoxville Symphony Society.
4. All regular Board members must be season ticket holders to either the Master works, Chamber or Pops series. This policy will be monitored on an annual basis.
5. All League members are encouraged to contribute to the Knoxville Symphony Society Support Drive, support and promote functions of the League and the Knoxville Symphony and volunteer to help with the Season Ticket Sales Committee and other committees of the League throughout the year.
6. All publicity is to be presented for approval to the League's Publicity Chairman who will coordinate with the office staff of the Knoxville Symphony Society.
7. All reimbursable expenses are to be submitted for approval to the League's treasurer with the President's approval prior to the expenditure.

## Knosville Symphony Orchestra History \& Organizational Profile

The mission of the Knoxville Symphony Orchestra is to develop and sustain a symphony orchestra of the highest artistic standards and to reach East Tennessee audiences of all ages by providing excellence in musical performance and education programs.
When Bertha Walburn Clark first performed with her string quartet in 1910, she laid the foundation for what would become the Southeast's oldest continuing orchestra and a pillar of East Tennessee's cultural life - the Knoxville Symphony Orchestra. Formally established in 1935, the Knoxville Symphony Orchestra began a period of significant growth in 1947 when David Van Vactor assumed dual roles as Chairman of the University of Tennessee's Department of Fine Arts and the KSO's Music Director. For the next 26 years, Van Vactor attracted many outstanding musicians to the community and nurtured the Orchestra's burgeoning reputation for excellence.
In 1973, under the director of Arpad Joo, the Orchestra began compensating all musicians for their services and required each player to audition. Zoltan Rozsnyai took the KSO to a new level of professionalism in 1978 when he hired 16 full-time string players who eventually formed the nucleus of the Knoxville Symphony's Chamber Orchestra.
In 1985, Maestro Kirk Trevor joined the orchestra as Music Director and Conductor. During his 18 -year tenure the Knoxville Symphony Orchestra was recognized as one of the finest regional orchestras in the United States. He broadened the musical spectrum of the KSO by adding the Pops and the Chamber series to the orchestra's regular season, as well as the highly-acclaimed Clayton Holiday Concerts.

An international search to replace Maestro Trevor brought Lucas Richman to the position of Music Director in 2003. He brings an exciting background in conducting and composing to the KSO having been recently honored at the annual Broadcast Music Incorporated Film and Television Awards Gala in Los Angeles.
18. If the League committee handling the event determines that they want and/or that it is necessary for KSO staff to attend, then the League issues the invitation and assumes payment at fair market value for the staff member(s)' attendance.

If the Society determines that staff should and/or would like to attend the event, then the Society and/or the employee makes payment at fair market value for the staff member(s)' attendance.

When the KSO Music Director and the Society Executive Director attend League events, by invitation or by choice, their attendance is always complimentary.

If payment for staff attendance at League events is not deemed complimentary or assumed by the League, then the Society staff member shall personally pay for attendance directly to the League. After attending the event, the the employee may turn in an expense report to the Society's Finance Office so that the Society will have proper documentation of approval of the attendance expense for business purposes.

Any exceptions to the above policy must be jointly agreed upon by the President of the Knoxville Symphony League and the Executive Director of the Knoxville Symphony Society.
19. To change the date or location of any of the three major Knoxville Symphony League fundraisers, the motion must be taken to the Executive Board. Upon their approval, it will then be submitted to the regular Board.

Continuing the orchestra's tradition of artistic excellence, he has focused additionally on the education and community partnerships programs and created a new Music and Wellness initiative that has been recognized nationally by the League of American Orchestras. He has also reinstituted Family Concerts featuring his own twist on the idea with Picardy Penguin, an animated character who appears on a screen above the orchestra and teaches children about classical music. The upcoming 2010-2011 season marks Maestro Richman's eighth year with the KSO.

The KSO performs a wide range of services for Knoxville and communities throughout East Tennessee, Southeast Kentucky and Southwest Virginia and annually performs for over 200,000 people, through classical, pops, family and educational concerts. Each season, in addition to the KSO's main classical series of eight concert pairs, the KSO also presents five Chamber Classics concerts, four Pops concerts, family concerts, four special holiday concerts with full orchestra, more than 150 in-school ensemble lecture/demonstrations and a number of community concerts in the surrounding region.

The Education Program is the primary vehicle through which the KSO reaches out to a broad segment of the community. Over 20,000 students, including inner-city youth and students with disabilities, throughout 19 counties in East Tennessee are served through programs in schools, through Young People's concerts with the full orchestra and through training in the Knoxville Symphony Youth Orchestras. KSO ensembles participate in area festivals, perform in arts magnet schools, in healthcare facilities and public libraries bringing live music to those who are unable to attend KSO concerts.

The oldest continuously performing symphony orchestra in the southeastern United States, the Knoxville Symphony Orchestra maintains its status as one of the finest regional orchestras in the nation.
