Per Monday's conference call, I think Brett put it well when he said that what makes you a powerful speaker is your ability to "endorse Mitt Romney from the perspective of a woman."

In addition, given that the theme of Monday night is "we can do better," I would add that your ability to "reject Obama's policies from the perspective of a woman" also has major power.

One challenge is writing a speech that will also speak to the men in the audience (considering they will be the majority of the audience at the convention and at home). If they tune you out, and don't participate in

the applause lines, that could facilitate a perception that your speech failed to resonate with the whole crowd – even if it does well with women.

It's great to be back here in the Beaver State! It holds a very special place in my heart because it's where I was born, it's where my parents were born, and my mom is still a huge Beavers fan!

Now -- in honor of my *original(!)* home state, I'd like to start with a story.

It's a story about opportunity, about freedom, and about <a href="mailto:another.com/anoth

It's a story that began in Polk County, Oregon in the mid-1850s -- when XXXX (NAME) braved the ice and snow as she trekked all the way across the country in a coveredwagon train. She was a single woman with <u>2-year old twin boys</u> and she came West because she wanted a <u>better and</u> <u>brighter future for her family.</u>

XXXX (NAME) settled in Rickreall -- not far from here -- and began her life out West -- at the same time a young man from Springfield, Illinois, Abraham Lincoln, was nominated to be America's first Republican President.

Our defeat has been a wake-up call to everyone in the Party – we have heard new ideas from every corner of America – suggestions on <u>ways to innovate and expand; ways to build a 21st Century Republican Party.</u>

Today I want to talk about the future of the Republican
Party. We do not need to moderate the party but we do
need to modernize it – to expand it to fit today's way of
life using today's technology.

From the time of our party's founding 158 years ago, the bedrock of our party has been this belief in individual liberty, that our individual rights were given to us by our Creator – from <u>Abraham Lincoln's</u> emancipation of the slaves – to <u>Susan B. Anthony's</u> campaign for women's suffrage – and <u>Ronald Reagan's</u> fight for political freedom in Eastern Europe and a higher quality of life here at home.

Solid conservative principles have always been successfully applied to the challenges of the times, <u>and</u> <u>we must do so again today.</u>

For too long, we have been talking like bookkeepers instead of like leaders. We have been looking down at the balance sheet instead of up to the future.

So today I want to suggest a cure for this ailment. We need to expand our audience and show that conservative principles offer the best opportunity for everyone – men AND women; young people starting out AND those about to retire; for people of every race, in every region of the country.

In 2012, the Democrats drummed up a phony Republican "War on Women."

Of course our party has never fought a War on Women – that was just the Democrats' politics of division.

But there was a very real "War **for** Women's Votes" ... and we lost that war ... by a mile.

Eighteen percent <u>more</u> women voted for Obama than for Romney.

It doesn't have to be that way.

Let's not forget: in 2010, we won the women's vote! It was women who fired the first woman Speaker of the House, Nancy Pelosi! There's no reason we can't win the women's vote again in 2014, in 2016 and in the years ahead.

Women comprise <u>54 percent of the voters</u> ... ten million more women than men vote in presidential elections.

The situation was made worse in 2012 when some Republican men just did not know when to keep their mouths shut.

But just stopping men from saying stupid things will not solve all of our problems.

In 1872, Susan B. Anthony said: "I shall work for the Republican Party and call on all women to join me, precisely for what that party has done and promises to do for women, nothing more, nothing less." [PAUSE]

In 2010 and 2012, I visited every battleground state, recruiting and supporting conservative women candidates.

Former British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher famously said, "If you want something said, ask a man ... if you want something done, ask a woman."

When I met with these wonderful, accomplished, smart women – women like our new Indiana House members Susan Brooks and Jackie Walorski, Senator Deb Fischer of Nebraska, Missouri's Ann Wagner and Mia Love -- I heard different questions than I hear when I talk to men.

The number-one challenge women ask about is *time*: how will I have the time to serve my community, advance my career, take care of my children AND serve in Congress?

As the mother of two young children, I tell them that it can be done. You know, I was SINGLE when I came to Congress. It wasn't until I was 37 that I met and married Mr. Wonderful, Brian Rodgers. And the greatest joy in my life has been becoming a wife and mother.

Serving in Congress is not that different from the situation faced by millions of other working moms.

It's not easy -- there are long hours and numerous demands, but I am fortunate to have the flexibility to take the kids to the doctor, go to my son's parent-teacher conferences and take my 2-year old daughter Grace to her dance lessons.

Of course, the most important element is having an incredible husband, and I've been blessed with that. Our campaign committee hasn't figured out a way to clone wonderful husbands – yet -- but I told Greg Walden to work on it.

Our recruiting efforts paid off. In 2010, <u>a record number</u>

of Republican women - 127 - ran for Congress and a
record number were elected – bringing nine new members
to the Conference.

We know that people respond to both the message **and the messenger.** But we will not fully succeed until we think beyond <u>delivering</u> the message – it's also about <u>developing</u> the message. [PAUSE]

Women have a concern for family and community – a social awareness – that is just different than men's.

[SLOWLY] We need to speak from the heart as well as the head. [PAUSE]

This doesn't mean that we should be less conservative.

We already have one liberal party in America and we don't need a second one.

In our own lives, we know that family – our children's safety and health – caring for our parents – living within our means - <u>these</u> are our most heartfelt concerns.

When the conservative message goes beyond numbers and starts to answer these questions, we will be speaking to 100 percent of the population.

We would talk to parents about how school choice can give their child the same opportunities that only wealthier children have today. We should talk about hiring and promoting teachers based on their <u>talents</u>, not their <u>seniority</u>.

We would speak out to construction workers about **building the Keystone pipeline** to give thousands of people a leg up, so every state could have the same 3 percent unemployment rate as North Dakota.

We would talk to office workers about <u>repealing outdated</u> <u>overtime regulations</u> that prevent employers from offering flex-time to employees who want control over their own schedule.

We would **change the tax code** so loopholes for special interests are eliminated. We would increase the child tax credit so there is no longer a marriage tax penalty.

We would talk to moms in the sandwich generation — taking care of their elderly parents and their own children — about how we need to fund medical research and repeal taxes on medical devices... so we can cure diseases and the most vulnerable can have a better chance.

We've heard these policy ideas before – but it's time for more of us to speak out on these employment and family issues.

It's time for us to reach men <u>and</u> women -- to speak with our hearts <u>and</u> our heads – in order to bring a new Republican vision to America.

As chair of the House Republicans, I've been working with the best people we can find in messaging, branding, and technology to rethink the way Republicans communicate.

We know we have to go to every corner of the country and talk to the American people in a way they understand.

That means using Twitter, Facebook, videos, infographics and the Web just as much as we use press releases and policy papers.

To give you just one example, last month we started a Twitter feed in Spanish – called GOP Espanol. And we have a staffer who is working full-time with Hispanic media to make sure our message is on Spanish-language television, radio, and newspapers.

We are working with all 232 House Republicans to help them be the most effective Members of Congress possible – to communicate with their constituents and to get up to speed on technology.

Let's consider <u>two places in America that have a</u>

<u>profound impact on our lives and future</u> – Washington,

DC – the center of government -- and Silicon Valley –

which along with the Northwest – is the center of technology innovation.

If you have an iPhone but are still using a 1040 to pay income taxes, you know which region has been more successful as an agent of change – technology keeps moving forward but government stagnates.

So, last spring, my staff and I visited Silicon Valley - Microsoft, Facebook and Apple - and we walked away inspired by their energy and "sky's the limit" approach.

Each company had a different culture: Microsoft is established and large, Apple's approach was more focused, fewer distractions -- actually black & white walls - fewer products, but cutting-edge technology.

<u>Facebook</u> seemed to be a company growing so fast. At their new campus, they had intentionally left walls unfinished to suggest that Facebook just doesn't have time to complete construction of office space ...

Compare that to where I work! The Capitol Building was completed <u>during the Civil War!</u>

So we're trying to bring a little Silicon Valley to

Washington, DC(!) – and you can learn more about what
we're doing at Conference by visiting our website -gop.gov.

Since the election, there has been a great deal written about how the Democrats used technology better than we did. In get out the vote efforts, identifying voters, the use of Big Data – we were outgunned.

For way too long too many Republicans thought that GOTV meant "GET-ON-TELEVISION."

It's true that we need to do better. And I have been working with Chairman Walden at the campaign committee and others in the House to move our use of technology to cutting edge.

But another thing we learned from Apple and Facebook is that technology alone does not make great products.

Great products begin with people – eager, creative, hardworking people. Great products – and great public policy – begin when you search for ways to make life better.

That must be our goal as Republicans.

We cannot allow the Democrats to continue to define us as rich, out-of-touch, old fashioned, and exclusive.

We are the party of conservative reformers that want to push this country forward to a higher quality of life for all.

What kind of Party is going to win elections in the future?

It's going to be a party of the 100 percent – one that includes all of us: women and men, every rung of the economic ladder and every bloodline.

It's going to be a party that speaks with its heart as well as its head, about budgets AND children, about taxes AND seniors.

After my family moved from Oregon, I spent my childhood on a small farm in Eastern Washington, and I was the first one in my family to graduate from college. I worked my way up in the state Legislature and then to Congress by working hard for the things I believe in and by speaking my mind about the things in my heart.

Working hard, getting ahead – that's the American Dream.

It's the same American Dream that my great, great grandmother sought when she came West nearly two centuries ago -- and it's the same American Dream we all seek today.

And I know the best Party to fulfill this dream for all Americans is the Republican Party ... today, tomorrow, and for the rest of America's days to come.





Rossi/Murray Debate #1 Questions

QUESTION #1 (Jim Camden):

The war in Afghanistan is becoming one of the longest wars this country has ever waged, and the casualty count is rising as the surge strategy is employed there similar to what was used in Iraq. Senator Murray supports a timetable for withdrawal; Mr. Rossi, you don't. But I'm wondering if you two could both tell us how long we should be willing to stay in Afghanistan and under what conditions should we be willing to leave?

RLOCE-0035

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ROSSI:

Thank you to the military families...take a step back and look at pre-9/11 in Afghanistan. Terrorist training camps. We can't let them come back into power. I don't agree with having a date to withdraw our troops. We could end up with more terrorist camps training people who want to kill us. We can't allow that to happen. Must give our military every tool possible to achieve our objectives.

QUESTION #2 (Voter):

What will you do to create more jobs for Washington State?

ROSSI:

We have a functional unemployment rate in Washington of 17.4%. Serious problem. I'm a small business man. People aren't expanding businesses because they don't know what their government is going to do next week, what health care is going to cost, tax cuts, etc. – too much uncertainty. Uncertainty is leaving them in limbo. They aren't going to expand their businesses. Stimulus failed and now we have a very large deficit. Business owners need STABILITY and CERTAINTY so they can expand their businesses and chase the American Dream, Government solution has failed.

QUESTION #3 (Michelle Dupler):

If you were to vote to increase spending for nuclear waste cleanup at Hanford, as the Washington State Department of Ecology has suggested may be necessary to meet targets in a 5-year plan, would you cut other parts of the federal budget to avoid increasing overall federal spending, and if so, what would you cut?

ROSSI:

We're going to have to make reductions in this budget. We need to go line by line in the budget. We need to end the stimulus. \$275 billion sitting there. No raises for a year = \$30 billion. You can make reductions in the budget. You can be fiscally conservative and have a social conscience – they're not mutually exclusive.

QUESTION #4 (Voter):

Given that it seems Social Security and other entitlement programs are underfunded, how would you recommend these issues be resolved for those already retired and for those eligible to retire in the next 20 years?

ROSSI:

We have to make sure we come through with what we promised to seniors, but social security has been used as a piggy bank. The biggest threat is going to be the debt. Right now we're borrowing money rather cheaply. We have some serious issues to deal with – because we have to make sure we are going to come through with what we promised. Democrats voted to raise taxes on social security. This impairs the programs we have for seniors, and high spending won't help us preserve these programs for seniors.

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QUESTION #5 (Nadine Woodward):

Republicans want to repeal health care reform. So what would you replace the current plan with?

ROSSI:

There are solutions. Allow individuals to buy health insurance across state lines. Lawsuit reform has helped reduced costs. Health Savings Accounts. Allowing individuals in small groups to ban together and buy health insurance like the big boys do. It doesn't cost the taxpayers a dime. There are answers here – and they won't bankrupt America.

QUESTION #6 (Voter):

As a Senator, what will you do to stop any dam removal on the Columbia and Snake Rivers? This question is important to Eastern Washington as jobs rely on the low-cost hydropower and the shipping lanes they provide.

ROSSI:

We have to make sure we protect these dams. They are vital to our economy, to the state of Washington, to the country.

QUESTION #7 (Jim Camden):

Last month in Tacoma a Federal Judge ordered the reinstatement of Major Margie Whitt, a Spokane nurse, back into her Air Force Reserve Unit at McChord AFB, after she was discharged under Don't Ask Don't Tell. Judge Leighton said Witt's being a lesbian wasn't disruptive to her air evacuation unit. Her discharge was. If what's being called the Witt standard is going to be applied across the military, the military will have to show that an individual soldier's discharge is better for the unit, that specific unit, than the entire military branch. Should Congress repeal Don't Ask Don't Tell or let it stand even in the face of the Whitt standard, and a separate federal court ruling that says Don't Ask Don't Tell is unconstitutional?

ROSSI:

Well, up until now, it appears to have been working, but I'm looking forward to seeing what the upcoming report says. We want to fully investigate before making a decision.

QUESTION #8 (Voter):

Hi my name is Ryan; I'm a senior at EWU. My question has to do with college fuition. I'm currently going to school full-time and working part-time. I'm in the process of getting a second job and I just took out another student loan to help pay for my bills. Unfortunately my parents' combined income is just over the line that would make me eligible for financial assistance from the government. My question is, what specifically would each candidates do to help bring relief to middle class families 0037

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like mine that aren't poor enough to receive assistance from the government but aren't rich enough to pay for everything either.

ROSSI:

Make sure there are loans available – and that there are need-grants available for those who cannot afford it. Part of the takeover of government has been the takeover of student loans. Students and parents should have options.

QUESTION #9 (Michelle Dupler):

Michelle Dupler: Would you support providing amnesty to undocumented workers currently living in the United States. If so, how would you determine who gets amnesty? If you would not, how would you address the shortage of seasonal agricultural labor if those workers were deported?

ROSSI:

This is a bigger issue – a complete and total failure on the federal government's part to control our borders. I don't support amnesty. We need to get control of our borders. We need a tall fence with a high gate – a physical barrier. It's been a failure on the federal government's part. We want people to come here to chase the American Dream, but we've gotta know who they are, if they have a criminal background, etc. We have a serious challenge ahead of us. Unfortunately, the federal government has failed us. We need people to come here – the "life blood" of people here are immigrants like my grandparents.

QUESTION #10:

Both of you are running ads that depict your opponent as having made poor decisions in the past; is there anything your opponent has done for the state of Washington that you approve of?

ROSSI:

Murray has done great work with veterans...

QUESTION #11:

With politics becoming more and more partisan and less amicable towards bipartisanship, what are your plans to close that gap, even if it means going against party leadership, and are you willing to risk alienating your party leadership to work for what is actually best for the American people and not for your career?

ROSSI:

The problem is too big for one party to solve...

QUESTION #12:

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There's been some talk about replacing the Air Force's tanker and both of you say you support Boeing building that tanker. You also say that illegal subsidies for Airbus should be taken into account for Boeing, but I'm also wondering, if Airbus can demonstrate it can build a better plane for less money why shouldn't the Pentagon give them the bid so we can start replacing those tankers at Fairchild?

ROSSI:

Airbus has an outrageous level of subsidies...we need to take that into account. Boeing needs to put a better product out, and then have it at Fairchild.

Riva's Debate Guidelines

GENERAL TIPS:

- LISTEN to the question in its entirety. If necessary, jot down notes as the reporter is asking the question just so you make sure you don't lose track of what is being asked. This is often one of the biggest challenges debaters face: they don't listen to the full question and then end up answering something unrelated. Don't fall into that trap.
- Map out in your head how you're going to answer the question before anything comes out of your mouth. You want to have a ROAD MAP before you respond aloud. This will enhance the clarity of your response and prevent you from rambling and/or digressing.
- ANSWER THE QUESTION THAT WAS ASKED. People often go straight to the talking points without answering the question that was posed. The last thing you want is for Daryl Romeyn to (accurately) accuse you of evading the question in his rebuttal. So make sure you address exactly what is being asked of you.
- Don't try to fit too much into your answer. Remember: you're only going to have 60 seconds for your answers and 30 seconds for you rebuttals. Stick to 1-2 main points. The more you try to fit in to a single answer, the more confusing and muddled you response will be. You'll generally only have time to respond to a single point during your rebuttals. At the end of the day, the winner of the debate will be the one whose message RESONATES the best. Your message will not resonate if you try to fit too much into your answers in the time allotted.

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- Always, always, always tie your answers back to the people of the 5th District. Make these issues local. Distill the larger issues into something the people can understand. Make it matter to them. For people who are disillusioned with politics right now, you want to leave no doubt in their minds that you care about *them*. Your message will only resonate if you tie it directly back to what you have done and what you will continue to do for your constituents.
- Use anecdotes when necessary. Show through example that you're an active and engaged member of Congress who listens to and is in touch with the people you represent.
- Keep the debate in your control. If Daryl Romeyn starts accusing you of something random, bring it back to the issues. The more effectively you do this, the more the debate will remain in your control.
- Remain calm, cool and collected and be confident that you know what you're talking about (because you do!). Convey that. Use your likability to your advantage! Be assertive yet nice.
 And don't forget to smile!

RESPONDING TO ROMEYN'S ATTACKS:

Since most of Romeyn's arguments won't be substantive, he's most likely going to resort to some pretty broad accusations about your job in Congress. He will do everything he can to show that he's the "common man" and you're the "career politician." Your job is to disprove his points simply by citing the facts and showing the viewers — through examples — that his arguments are neither valid nor accurate.

Daryl Romeyn will attempt to draw a "mirror opposite negative" between you and him by:

- · Portraying you as a member of the Washington (DC) establishment,
- · Accusing you of being out of touch with the people,
- Lambasting you for voting with the Republican Party 97% of the time, and
- · Being a career politician.

In order to win this debate, you need to effectively refute those claims. You need to show – by citing examples – that you are in touch with the electorate. Mention how often you come back to the District, how long you and your family have lived in the District, how much time you've spent talking to the people in the District. Don't leave a doubt in anyone's mind that you understand, care about, and work for the people of the 5th District.

He's also going to accuse you of being incredibly partisan. Your job is to rebut this point by <u>using examples</u> that prove the opposite. Mention all the times you have reached across the aisle, worked with Democrats on major initiatives, co-sponsored bi-partisan legislation, voted against Republican policies (i.e. TARP in October 2008). You need to mention that you put PEOPLE and PRINCIPLES first, NOT PARTY.

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He will accuse you of being part of the Establishment that got us into this economic mess. He will tie the 5 District's suffering economy to YOU. Again, your job is to show that the opposite is true; that you have repeatedly voted against the failed "spend, borrow and bailout" policies of this Administration and that you're working every day to ensure that the people of the 5th District have opportunities to pursue the American Dream and succeed in this economy.

ROMEYN'S TALKING POINTS:

Almost everything he will say will most likely come from these "arguments" below. I've condensed them into short bullet points so you get an idea of where he stands. Familiarize yourself with his "platform" and be prepared to respond to it.
