Conditions for Approval. In spite of this waiver, you should exercise caution in accepting any gift offered because of your status as a House Member, officer, or employee. You should consider the gift's source and value as well as any possible actual or appearance of conflicts of interest. *If you are required to file an annual Financial Disclosure Statement, you must report all gifts totaling more than \$480 from a single source; however, gifts having a value of \$192 or less need not be counted towards that \$480 limit.*
