RESOLUTION

Whereas Members, Delegates, or Employees of the House of Representatives participated in officially-connected travel in 2007 and 2008 that was sponsored, funded, or organized by Carib News or the Carib News Foundation;

Whereas certain allegations have arisen related to the sponsorship of officially connected travel in 2007 and 2008 that was sponsored, funded, or organized by Carib News or the Carib News Foundation;

Whereas pursuant to Committee Rule 18(a) the Chair and Ranking Member of the Committee jointly engaged in informal fact-finding to gather additional information concerning these allegations;

Whereas the conduct of a Member, Delegate, or Employee of the House, in connection with the aforementioned allegations, may violate the Code of Official Conduct or one or more law, rule, regulation, or other standard of conduct applicable to the conduct of a Member, Delegate, or Employee of the House in the performance of the duties or the discharge of the responsibilities of such individuals; and

Whereas the Committee has authority to empanel an investigative subcommittee regarding such conduct pursuant to House Rule XI, clauses 3(a)(2) and (3)(b)(2), and pursuant to Committee Rules 14(a)(3) and 18; and

Whereas the Committee has determined pursuant to Committee Rule 1(c) that the interests of justice require the adoption of special procedures in order for the Committee to carry out its investigative and enforcement responsibilities with respect to the aforementioned allegations;

It is hereby resolved by the Committee

- That an Investigative Subcommittee be established with jurisdiction to conduct a
 full and complete investigation into any conduct of House Members or staff
 related to their participation in officially-connected travel in 2007 and 2008 that
 was sponsored, funded, or organized by Carib News or the Carib News
 Foundation;
- 2. That the scope of the inquiry may extend to any matters related to the jurisdiction of the Investigative Subcommittee as set forth in this resolution;
- 3. That at the conclusion of its inquiry, the Investigative Subcommittee shall report to the Committee its findings, conclusions, and recommendations;
- 4. That the Members of the Investigative Subcommittee shall be designated pursuant to Committee Rule 19(a);
- 5. That Committee Rules 7 (Confidentiality), 8(a) (Subcommittees General Policy and Structure), 9 (Quorums and Member Disqualification), and 10 (Vote

Requirements) are fully applicable to this inquiry by the Investigative Subcommittee;

6. That the Investigative Subcommittee is authorized to obtain evidence and relevant information by the means and in the manner set forth in Committee Rules 19(b) – (c), except as those rules apply to respondents;

7. That witnesses before the Investigative Subcommittee shall be furnished with a copy of the special procedures for this inquiry (as set forth in this resolution), as well as accorded the rights set forth in Committee Rules 26(k) – (0);

8. That the Committee intends that all witnesses who provide testimony before the Investigative Subcommittee should be sequestered and should not communicate with any other witnesses regarding any aspect of their testimony unless the Investigative Subcommittee permits otherwise;

9. That at any point during its inquiry, or at the conclusion of its inquiry, the jurisdiction of the Investigative Subcommittee may be expanded in accordance with the requirements of Committee Rule 19(d) if the Investigative Subcommittee obtains information indicating that a Member, officer, or employee of the House may have committed a violation of the Code of Official Conduct or any law, rule, regulation, or other standard of conduct applicable to the conduct of such Member, officer, or employee in the performance of his or her duties or the discharge of his or her responsibilities. If the scope of jurisdiction of the Investigative Subcommittee is expanded to investigate the conduct of an identified Member, officer, or employee of the House, the inquiry regarding the identified Member, officer, or employee shall proceed before the same Investigative Subcommittee and in accordance with all the Rules of the Committee regarding an inquiry involving a respondent;

10. That except as otherwise provided in this Resolution, the Rules of the Committee shall be applicable in this matter and will be interpreted by the Investigative Subcommittee and the Committee in a manner not inconsistent with this Resolution.



Dear Mr. Wise:

We represent Mr. Karl Rodney, Carib News and the Carib News Foundation with respect to the above referenced Request for Information. While you have asked for our clients' voluntary cooperation, which they are not obligated to provide, and in light of your informal assurances that you have no basis at this time to believe that our clients have acted inappropriately with respect to this matter, we enclose herewith documents responsive to your request. To the extent that the Freedom of Information Act is applicable to any submissions made to the Office of Congressional Ethics, our clients hereby request that the information provided be treated confidentially.

By way of background, Mr. Rodney is a native of Jamaica and has been active in the Caribbean American community for decades, having served as President of the Jamaica Progressive League, the largest Caribbean organization in the United States. In 1982, Mr. Rodney recognized that there was no media outlet for the growing Caribbean American community. So, after 15 years of employment with Equitable Life Insurance, Mr. Rodney and

his wife, Faye, pooled their resources to found Carib News. The weekly newspaper has been in circulation for 28 years and boasts a stellar reputation throughout the country and Caribbean region. Its mission is to disseminate news that is relevant to its readership as well as provide information for immigrant readers who are acclimating to life in the United States.

The work of Carib News is largely guided by its social mission to build a bridge of understanding and strong alliance between the Caribbean American and African American communities, and the community at large. For example, each year, Carib News hosts approximately 20 editorial board meetings at its office, inviting members of the community and local elected officials to discuss pressing issues and to educate the community on how the system works. Past speakers have included former New York Governor George Pataki, Mayor Michael Bloomberg, New York City School Chancellor Joel Klein and various health commissioners and high profile businesspersons making a difference in the community. Carib News then publishes editorials of the meeting's content for all of its readers. Carib News also organizes and sponsors community outreach meetings in the five boroughs throughout the year on key issues to the community, e.g., mortgages.

In furtherance of the goals of his organizations, Mr. Rodney has held several unpaid positions, including membership on the Board of the New York City Partnership with David Rockefeller, the Board of the United Way of New York, the Board of the New York Urban League and the Board of the Greater Harlem Chamber of Commerce. He was also an instrumental participant in the founding of the Caribbean Cultural Center, the Caribbean American Chamber of Commerce and several service organizations in the community.

In 1985, the Rodneys recognized a void in the business connection between the United States and Caribbean. Seeking to foster business and education contacts between the two regions through first-hand contact and information, the first annual Caribbean Multi-National Business Conference (the "Conference") was held. Later, in 1998, the Carib News Foundation (formerly Carib News Charities) was founded to support the community outreach program of Carib News. The Foundation receives modest annual contributions unrelated to the Conference and has sponsored cultural tributes such as Mother of the Year awards through Carib News and other Caribbean heritage events. The Foundation's involvement with the Conference has evolved and increased over the years.

The Conference has grown in size throughout the years. Its agenda includes dozens of speakers with specific areas of relevant expertise, including distinguished professionals and state and federal public officials from the United States and the Caribbean region. Over its history, the Conference has generated serious business interest and commercial opportunities in the region. While our clients are appreciative of the past participation of Members of the United States Congress, the Conference is in no way dependent on their participation, and the Conference would, indeed, proceed in their absence.

In promoting the Conference, Mr. Rodney and his organizations have welcomed the financial support and meaningful participation of corporations interested in marketing their services to the Caribbean American community and the region, as well as those with social development programs in areas of, e.g., education, health, and the environment. relationships with these corporations spans several years and grew out of Carib News' record of partnership in promoting such programs.

You will note in your review of the enclosed documents that our clients have been in regular contact in recent years with staff members at the House of Representatives in completing the necessary paperwork for the Conference. In 2006, for example, then-Chair Representative Doc Hastings and then-Ranking Minority Member Representative Howard L. Berman, in a reply letter to Michele Rodney, acknowledged Ms. Rodney's explanation of the Conference's finances and the fact that Carib News Foundation would be paying for Member travel expenses while the corporate participants "provide a contribution to the overall pool of expenses of the Conference."

In 2007, when the forms and requirements had been significantly changed since the 2006 process, Dawn Kelly Mobley, Esq., the Ethics Counsel for the late Congresswoman Stephanie Tubbs Jones, as well as Susan L. Olson, Esq., Peg Perl, Esq. and Hilary Smith of the House Committee on Standards of Official Conduct each worked with Ms. Patricia Louis of Carib News regarding how to properly complete the Private Sponsor Travel Certification Form.

For example, in an email to Ms. Louis, dated September 19, 2007, Ms. Kelly Mobley clarified the definition of "sponsor" by distinguishing between organizations that "take part in sponsoring food and other parts of the [Conference] travel," as opposed to the "official sponsor...providing travel, lodging and organizing the trip." (emphasis in original). Ms. Kelly Mobley advised in her email that it was only the "official sponsor" that may not retain or employ a registered lobbyist or registered foreign agent, and who must have a direct and immediate relationship with the event.

In another email, dated October 11, 2007, Ms. Louis explained to House Counsel Susan L. Olson that the Conference's corporate participants "contribute to the overall expense of the trip and the general work of the [Carib News] Foundation." Ms. Olsen responded with a question by email dated October 12, 2007, "Do the [corporate participants] pay for any of the expenses of the trip for the invited House Members, including roundtrip air transportation costs, lodging costs, meal costs, costs of a particular meal or reception, etc.?" Since, as discussed above, the costs specified by Ms. Olson were covered by Carib News' sponsorship of the Conference, Ms. Louis replied, "No."

After subsequent correspondence between Ms. Olson, Ms. Kelly Mobley and Mr. Bill O'Reilly, Ms. Kelly Mobley writes to Ms. Louis on October 12, 2007, "I have explained [to Susan Olson] that the organizations you labeled as co-sponsors are not. They support your foundation annually, but have not and will not pay for the Members trip. This is simply a misunderstanding of the terms "sponsor," "contributor," and "participant" as used in the Ethics rules."

House Members and staff may not accept travel funded by a lobbyist or registered foreign agent, even when the lobbyist or foreign agent will be reimbursed by a client or employer.

Dear Mr. Chisam:

In response to the Committee's letter of July 31, 2009, requesting my witness testimony before the Investigative Subcommittee concerning certain allegations related to the 2007 and 2008 Carib News Foundation conferences, I continue to offer as much assistance as possible. I would, however, like to respond to your letter and ask that you share my response with the Chairman, Ranking Member, and Reps. Miller and Simpson, of the Investigative Subcommittee.

On August 11, 2009, you took my sworn testimony. During the solicitation of my testimony, Clifford Stoddard referred to several emails secured from the Office of Congressional Ethics (OCE) containing communication between a Carib News employee and me. Questions were also posed concerning a video taken during one of the Carib News conferences. I subsequently communicated with Clifford and requested a copy of the OCE report. He told me he would request the report of the OCE for me since a significant portion of it concerned me, and later, offered to speak with Members of the Subcommittee about my obtaining a copy.

However on November 19, 2009, I received a message from my intern that Clifford had just called about a 10 AM meeting at the Committee. Though we had previously discussed meeting, Clifford and I had not confirmed the meeting because I still awaited a response on my request for the OCE report and review of my sworn testimony. Despite the lack of confirmation, I rushed to the Committee offices and briefly met the Members of the Investigative Subcommittee. Of the Subcommittee, I requested the OCE report and a review of my transcript. The Members asked Clifford to speak with me outside the Committee hearing room. During my conversation with Clifford, I told him he had not given me notice of the interview, and again, requested the OCE report. Clifford indicated that in speaking with his Staff Director, it was decided I could not receive a copy of the report since I had not been a target of the OCE referrals concerning this investigation. He then volunteered that the "only things the report contained (about me) were the emails". Clifford also said the interview would be rescheduled because the Members had to be finished by 11:30 AM.

For a number of reasons, I request this matter be dismissed without disclosure of the OCE findings and report including the email communications from Carib News.² First, investigation of the 2007 Carib

¹ You were accompanied by Clifford Stoddard and Donald Sherman. Mr. Stoddard posed the majority of questions and made all Committee references to the findings and evidence obtained from the Office of Congressional Ethics (OCE) or other investigative sources.

² Because I was not allowed the OCE report, I was unable to review whether applicable timelines were honored by the OCE in reviewing and referring the complaint, OCE report, and findings to the Committee on Standards.

News CODEL violates Resolution 895 which states that "No review shall be undertaken by the board of any alleged violation of law, rule, regulation, or other standard of conduct not in effect at the time of the alleged violation; nor shall any review be undertaken by the board of any alleged violation that occurred before the date of adoption of this resolution." Resolution section 1(e). The Resolution was adopted on March 11, 2008. Because the OCE investigated and referred this matter to the Committee which occurred before March 11, 2008, the OCE violated H. Res 895 and had no jurisdictional authority. As a result, I request that the matter be dismissed without public disclosure of the report and findings. Indeed if the OCE referred the matter for further review, the Committee apparently honored that referral by creating the Investigative Subcommittee, investigating, securing and using physical and documentary evidence, and taking sworn testimony. Given such, the Committee's actions have been consistent with any recommendation for further review which could have been lodged by the OCE Board and a dismissal of the complaint without disclosure of the report and findings would be proper.³

Moreover improperly or illegally obtained evidence should likewise be dismissed without public disclosure. Indeed, the National Legal and Policy Center (NLPC), through its media reports, web listings, and distributions has made no mystery about its provision of audio and video tapes it improperly and secretly made during one of the Carib News conferences which it submitted to the OCE. On May 22, 2009, the NLPC states the Standards Committee also requested NLPC's recordings; which it furnished.⁴ However in its May 18, 2009 letter to supporters and contributors, the NLPC describes how it crashed the 2008 Carib News conference, entered the event uninvited, and took video and audio tapes. The NLPC letter states of the 2008 conference, "The New York Post reporter and photographer, who were with me, were denied entry to the event. But I made it inside." The letter further reads in part, "I mingled and acted like I belonged. I knew my act was over, however when a burly guy approached me and asked if I was Peter Flaherty. I could see he had my picture in his hand. He said he was with the Police Korps of St. Maarteen and I was being detained." It states "I (Peter Flaherty) raced back to my hotel room to get my camera, recording device and my laptop out of there. I handed them off to the Post reporter in case the "Kops" or anyone else came looking for them." ⁶ Mr. Flaherty trespassed on the conference because "the trip was supposed to be for an annual Caribbean business conference. We figured it would be worth monitoring this year's event." Mr. Flaherty's trespass resulted in improperly obtained evidence in violation of H. Res. 895 which states, "The Office shall not review any document, recording or physical evidence that was obtained in violation of any law, rule, or regulation. When an individual submits evidence to the Office, s/he shall be asked to affirm to the best of their ability that the evidence was not obtained in violation of any law, rule, or regulation."8 NLPC was not an invited guest. It, Mr. Flaherty, and the reporters who accompanied him, crashed the conference. As a result, the evidence was unlawfully obtained and should not have been reviewed by the OCE or referred to the Standards Committee. It should be dismissed without disclosure as a part of the originating complaint.9

If the Committee's position is that this investigation was self-initiated pursuant to Committee Rule 18 (a), this review, resulting from improperly obtained evidence and email messages formed in violation of H. Res 895, should likewise be dismissed without public disclosure; for the same reasons stated above.

Finally, my review of this matter came only at the behest of the former Committee Staff Director, Bill O'Reilly, who asked that I return a call to the Carib News number he then handed me. In speaking with the Carib News representative, Pat, I took her concerns and questions to Susan Olson, who advised me on how to address them. Susan had been on the Committee much longer than other Advice attorneys. I also shared these conversations with Bill O'Reilly as they progressed. I discussed the telephone calls and emails with Susan and Bill O'Reilly, who assigned Susan as Advice Counsel. At all times, I only attempted and intended to further the work of the Committee.

For all the reasons stated above and as a witness to this investigation, I request that my previous testimony stand, this investigation be terminated, and the complaint dismissed without public disclosure.

The sponsor of the trip was the Carib News Foundation, but it was funded by "lead sponsor" Citigroup, a major recipient of bailout funds, which contributed \$100,000. Other sponsors included IBM, AT&T, Verizon, Pfizer, Macy's and American Airlines.

As Susan Crabtree points out (http://thehill.com, leading-the-news caribbean-trip-under-scruziny-by-house-panel-2009-06-01.html) The Hill:

Democrats imposed stricter limits on corporate-sponsored travel to prevent the type of abuse unearthed during the Jack Abramoff scandal. Lawmakers who attended Abramoff-organized golf junkets to London and Scotland, as well as other luxurious locales, listed several nonprofits as having paid for the travel even though corporations footed the bill.

This junket was described in a major article in the *New York Post* on November 30, 2008, and was also the subject of an article in *The Hill* on January 28, 2009. Moreover, I discussed it on CNBC on January 29, 2009. Yet it took months for the Committee to request the evidence from NLPC.

September 30, 2008 Conference Call with Karl & Fay Rodney of Carib News (PGP typed up on 12/22/08 based on notes taken contemporaneous with the phone call)

Karl & Fay Rodney are the co-founders & directors of Carib News. My general approach was to walk through the questions on the Private Sponsor Travel Certification Form submitted 9/10/08 to verify some issues.

Sponsorship of Conference, funding by lobbyists or other sources (Questions 1-3):

I asked about the Foundation and any corporate giving to the Foundation that was specifically for financing the conference or earmarked for congressional travel. I specifically referenced things I had seen on the website from last year's conference that listed "corporate sponsors" of the conference, etc. Responses and explanations given by the Rodneys:

- Carib News Foundation is a 501(c)(3) organization that does numerous educational and outreach activities" and the conference is one of them.
- Corporations with lobbyists give money generally to the Foundation all year that goes into a general fund that is used for multiple program activities, including the conference.
- There is no designation or earmarking of funds by corporations for the conference or congressional travel, and no specific request to get corporate funding for congressional travel.
- There will not be parts of the conference "sponsored" by a particular corporation recognized such as a banner with "this lunch sponsored by AT&T." This is the plan for 2008's conference, regardless of past years. Any website indicates to the contrary are wrong and outdated

Trip arranged without regard to Congressional participation & air/hotel costs (Questions 16-21):

I asked about the apparent difference between the online registration packages and the costs quoted here for Congressional travel in order to make sure the Congressional participation was at the same level as all other attendees at the conference. Responses and explanations given by the Rodneys:

- There will be about 300 attendees total at the conference.
- They are purchasing a conference package with the Resort to cover lodging, meals, etc. including all conference luncheons as well.
- The hotel negotiated rate is \$110 for the most basic room, which is the same for Members and everyone else. This only applies for the dates of the conference, so if Members want to add personal days, they will be adding nights at a much higher rate for personal expense just like all other attendees.
- The meals expenses are that many meals are included with the room (all-inclusive resort breakfast, cocktail hours, etc.), but there is an additional \$145 per person that covers some additional conference diners and receptions.
- The Members' flights are all commercial economy class no charter flight or anything special from other attendees. The \$410 per person estimate is the average for a flight from NYC, but it will vary for Members who come from other cities.

Other Costs not included on form/Local transportation or events:

Based upon problems from last year, I specifically asked about any local transportation or any other expenses that were not on the sponsor certification form. I also generally asked whether everything on the agenda was at the resort hotel or if other events were happening around the island(s). Responses and explanations given by the Rodneys:

- They are waiving the conference fee for participants and might provide ground transportation or taxis from airport, etc.
- Carib News is paying for everything no local government or private company paid dinners.
- The meeting with foreign ministers is at the Resort hotel and is not open to the public only Members are invited and all other conference attendees will be in other panels at that time.
- The "host country cultural program" is a dinner at the hotel paid for by Carib News. The only thing the host country pays is the entertainment.
- A revised sponsor certification form with these additional expenses and details about locations on the itinerary will be provided.

Follow-up after 9/30 phone call

Carib News did provide a revised form and itinerary after the conversation. I followed up with an email with questions and another revised itinerary was provided. Through these revisions and additional phone calls with Fay Rodney in October, Carib News stated that all events would be held on the resort grounds and there would not be any meals or events anywhere else on the island.

This afternoon Faye Rodney called to express her distress, displeasure and great concern that executives from HSBC bank informed her that they intend to pull their financial support from the 2008 Carib News Foundation Conference. When asked why--the bankers responded-- because of the front page New York Post Story. The Rodney's have been advised that although the bank has made a decision on sponsorship the President of HSBC bank is willing to meet with them at 1 pm on Monday.

Mrs. Rodney explained to Jim, Elbert and me that as of today the Foundation's other major sponsor ATT is holding strong, but the revelation that HSBC is pulling out might well rattle other sponsors and put the future of the Conference in jeopardy.

Mrs. Rodney has spoken to Lanny Davis who advised her to speak directly to the New York Post. Lanny assured her he could put her in contact with a Post reporter who would be fair and correct the inaccuracies of the initial story. Mrs. Rodney declined this offer because she is very skeptical about the intentions and sincerity of the Post reporters. Rodney implored Lanny to defend her newspaper and the Congressman.

Carib News has retained George Artz, a public relations expert, to assist in drafting a letter to the editor of the Post; however the Rodney's are

reluctant to send the letter because they are afraid of retribution. The Rodney's expressed to us several times their displeasure because they have always followed the rules, have done nothing wrong, and have lost support in the business community because of the Post's hatchet job.

POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS

After conferring with George and Emile, we determined that there are several options we might explore to preserve HSBC's commitment to the Conference.

- 1. Bill Thompson was honored at the luncheon sponsored by Carib News for the CARICOM Conference, and was praised by HSBC bank executives as being instrumental in bringing opportunity to the Caribbean in the form of the NYC pensions fund investments. Moreover, Thompson has consistently indicated that he would do whatever is necessary to support you at this time. It might be helpful if Thompson reach out directly to HSBC to see if reconsideration is an option.
- 2. Mayor Bloomberg is very fond of Mrs. Rodney and has expressed support for her over the years. Perhaps Thompson might go through back channels with the Mayor or the Council Speaker to see if HSBC bank will reconsider (or) to determine if another bank might intercede on the Rodney's behalf.
- 3. Congressmen Meeks and Towns have participated in the trip in the past, and might offer letters of support for Carib News and the Conference. This might enable the Rodney's to reclaim support in the community without your direct involvement—which could appear hollow or self serving.



Dear Mr. Stoddard:

Per our conversation last week, I am attaching copies of the electronic tickets issued by American Airlines ("American") to the seven (7) congressional travelers who attended the 2007 Carib News Multinational Business Conference in Antigua. (Tab A) These tickets were issued pursuant to American's donation to the Carib News Foundation ("Carib News"), which consisted of eighteen (18) roundtrip tickets (6 first class and 12 coach).

For the 2008 conference held in St. Maarten, American initially agreed to donate ten (10) first class tickets, but later, at Carib News's request, American agreed that a first class ticket could be exchanged for two coach tickets. Carib News ultimately utilized 10 tickets – (7) business class and three (3) economy class² – all of which were issued to non-congressional travelers. Attached is a chart listing the names of the ten (10) individuals who received the tickets, along with the corresponding "eTicket Itinerary and Receipt Confirmation" each was provided. (Tab B) (Please note that a second chart we are providing includes the name of a non-congressional traveler, D. Higgins, who was ticketed but canceled prior to the flight.)

Fifteen (15) of the tickets were issued by American Airlines' government affairs office and three (3) were issued by its New York sales office.

² For travel to the Caribbean, "business class" is equivalent to "first class" and "economy" is equivalent to "coach."

Per your request, we also are providing other documentation identified in relation to American's donations to Carib News for the 2007 and 2008 conferences, including Carib News' solicitation of American for those donations. (Tabs C & D)

Finally, you have asked American Airlines to provide the tax valuation for the tickets it donated to Carib News in connection with the 2007 and 2008 conferences. The tickets American Airlines donates to outside organizations are referred to as "Travel Authorization Certificates" ("TACs"). Because American Airlines does not seek a business deduction for TACs donated to outside organizations, the TACs donated to Carib News were not assigned a tax value, and, to the best of our knowledge, Carib News never requested a valuation for the tickets donated by American,

I hope the documentation we are providing is satisfactory. If we identify any additional documents that are responsive to your requests, we will provide them to you as soon as possible. Please let me know if you have any questions or require additional information.

Pursuant to House Rule 25, clause 5(d)(2), the Committee on Standards of Official Conduct hereby approves your proposed trip to St. Maarten, N.A. scheduled for November 6 to 11, 2008 sponsored by the Carib News Foundation. We note that this trip includes 2 days at your personal expense.

You must complete a Member Travel Disclosure Form and file it with the Clerk of the House within 15 days after your return from travel. As part of that filing, you are required to attach a copy of this letter and the Private Sponsor Travel Certification Form, including attachments. You must also report all travel expenses totaling more than \$335 from a single source on Schedule VII of your annual Financial Disclosure Statement.

Because the trip may involve meetings with foreign government representatives, we note that House Members may accept, under the Foreign Gifts and Decorations Act, gifts "of minimal value [currently \$335] tendered as a souvenir or mark of courtesy" by a foreign government. Any tangible gifts valued in excess of \$335 received from a foreign government must, within 60 days of acceptance, be disclosed on a Form for Disclosing Gifts from Foreign Governments and either turned over to the Clerk of the House, or, with the written approval of the Committee, retained for official use.

However, we would note that since this trip is scheduled to commence after the general election on November 4, 2008 and because officially-connected travel must be related to official duties, it may be questionable whether a Member who was not reelected in the general election should to accept an invitation for a trip that is fact-finding in nature. Arguably, as of that time, the official responsibilities that may justify the acceptance of travel expenses for such a purpose will have come to an end. This consideration generally will not limit the Committee's authority to approve travel of a departing Member to participate substantially in an officially-related event (for example, to give a speech). Please keep this guidance in mind, as you may need to reevaluate your ability to participate in the trip following the election.



SUBJECT: Re-Cap of Discussion with Congressman Charles Rangel

We were very delighted to have had a direct, most informative and very inspirational talk with the Congressman, and he requested that we summarize the talk and send it on to you to start the implementation process. The discussion fell essential in three parts:

- 1. The 12th Annual Caribbean Multi-National Business Conference
- 2. The initiative to host the CARICOM Prime Ministers in June 2008
- 3. Arrangements for the Congressman to participate in a CARIB NEWS Editorial Board Meeting with community leaders

The Caribbean Multi-National Business Conference scheduled to be held in Antigua/Barbuda on November 8-11, 2007. As usual, the Congressman offered to be helpful in any situation that is possible, and we advised him that we were already working with you on some specific items and that you will brief him on those. We also told him we are planning a meeting in Washington with you and other key players.

We expressed the idea of building on specific segments of the conference around a presentation by him. He had no problem with that, but he was more concerned about the priority setting of the CARICOM Leaders. We might want to find a way prior to the conference to focus on some specific achievables. I will speak with Dame Billie Miller.

He expressed concern that the CARICOM leaders were not leveraging their 15+ votes at the U.N. to play a more impactful role in the court of world opinion. He was passionate about the case of Haiti and *CARICOM's* ability to be more effective there.

He expressed a vision of Haiti as being -

- The Mecca of Black consciousness
- The Triumph of Haiti over the French
- The Heroism of Toussaint L'Ouverture

should be a major draw from Blacks around the world.

While we might not be able to develop a specific Haitian plan in November, we might want to highlight Haiti more and the Round Table on Haiti could be used as a planning session for a stronger future initiation.

He expressed the need for CARICOM to move seriously to achieve a Uniform Customs System. He expressed the possibility of inviting representatives down to be more practical around the issue facing the Caribbean.

Understood the issue of the WTO and Antigua, and wanted to be helpful. (Congresswoman Maxine Waters is very hot on this issue).

On the question of Criminal Deportees, he felt the Caribbean emphasis was misplaced on stopping the deportations. More emphasis should be on getting funds to help in the Transition Program.

The Caribbean needs to look more seriously beyond the Sun and Sea as the economic underpinning of the economy and expand the vision.

He was concerned that sometimes the National Pride of the Caribbean countries affect their effectiveness as a region.

He said he was prepared and available to offer whatever leadership he could in the various areas; he suggested we meet to provide the Forum and the Focus.

He expressed the notion that Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice might be at a point where she is looking at her broader legacy. He suggested that working with you, we should invite her. He felt even in her final year, there may be things she can do for the Caribbean.

2. TO HOST THE CARICOM PRIME MINISTERS IN JUNE 2008 IN NEW YORK

The Congressman took the position that the Prime Ministers visit to New York could benefit the Region significantly, by raising awareness, mobilizing the Diaspora and taking advantage of the intrinsic values of New York - Financial, Communication, Entertainment.

He did not want to take the lead openly and to be in conflict with the elected officials from the Caribbean laden districts, but at the same time provide a distinctive agenda and leadership fitting the Prime Ministers visit.

We told him of preliminary discussions we have had regarding the inclusion of a Wall Street Activities Corporate outreach that is so clearly New York.

He suggested *CARIB NEWS* might be the host and bring all the parties together at least initially for a planning session. He expressed the desire for the Harlem Experience and certainly an Apollo event, simply because Harlem was the International Capital of Black people.

He was very complimentary of Dame Billie Miller, Barbados Minister of Foreign Affairs and Foreign Trade and also noted that Barbados Prime Minister Owen Arthur was very receptive to the suggestion. We have since spoken to Dame Miller and she is enthusiastically committed to the concept.

The Congressman and us agreed that we should consider opening concept and preliminary structure and we could meet around informally and thus develop in the next two months with the plan that we would be able to make some announcement at the Conference in Antigua & Barbuda.

3. <u>EDITORIAL BOARD MEETING WITH CONGRESSMAN RANGEL</u>



You have been invited again (invitation attached) this year to participate in the 12th Annual Carib News Foundation's 2008 Conference in the Caribbean. This forum was created to provide an opportunity for organizations and individuals from the United States to dialogue and learn more about regional issues of common interest. George, Jim, Emile and I have also been invited. Emile will not attend, I will not attend, November 7th is my Mother's birthday and I would like to share the day with her. I am not sure if George or Jim plan to attend attend.

Unfortunately on September 14, 2008 the New York Post wrote an unfair and knowingly false article "Another Power 'Trip' By Rangel" (attached) which falsely accused you of participation in a high priced vacation to the Caribbean.

Pursuant to the rules adopted at the beginning of the 110th Congress a Member may accept travel in connection with the individuals official duties that is paid for by a private source, provided that the Member receives written approval by the Standards Committee, the private sponsor receives approval from the Standards Committee and 15 days post travel the appropriate trip disclosures are filed explaining meeting and events attended. The same rules apply to Members staff traveling with the Member. The main prohibition for such trips is that participation by a lobbyist is strictly prohibited. Notably lobbyists do not attend or participate in the Carib News Foundation's Conferences.

Contrary to the NYP's allegations, in 2007 you did file the appropriate Member disclosure forms with the Standards Committee before you went on

the trip. However the only omission was that the post trip Member disclosure forms were not filed. It has since been filed with the Committee.

Presently you must consider your 2008 invitation to attend the Carib News Foundations Annual Conference. You have participated in almost every Conference since its inception 12 years ago. You are beloved by Faye and Karl Rodney. You have very strong support in the Caribbean Community.

You must not permit the sleazy NYP from interfering with your congressional duties. That said, I am certain that the NYP will have a reporter covering the trip; and will publish a story whether you attend or not. If you do not attend, the NYP will write that you were afraid to attend based on their reports. If you do attend, ALL NECESSARY and APPROPRIATE Committee filings must be made and filed in a timely manner. George has filed the pre trip 2008 Member disclosure forms.

You might consider only attending for one day similar to Governor Paterson's plans. And although more casual dress might be appropriate, it would be best to be photographed in business attire reflecting the seriousness of the Conference.



Thank you for forwarding to Melissa Gumbs, a preliminary list of registrants for the upcoming CaribNews conference, to be held at the Sonesta Maho Beach Resort & Casino.

Myself, Jean-Jacques Vodak (Director of Convention Services) and Melissa Gumbs (Asst. Sales Manager) attended the meeting with officials of the St. Maarten government and other agencies last Thursday afternoon to discuss the plans for this important upcoming event.

Based on the outcome of this meeting and the Group Contract signed by myself, Mr. Karl Rodney and Mr. Bernard Hunt, following are some updates:

1. Reservations procedures: In order to process the rooming list, we would need to receive payment for each individual to guarantee the first night. This could be made via credit card, that would be processed, by certified check or cash for the amount due. Based on this list, only one reservation is for a Junior suites, all others are in Standard rooms, which is the main category contracted. We have noted the requests for room locations. We trust that said payment will be forthcoming by September 30.

Government has indicated that they may be paying for a select number of VIP rooms; however, without more accurate information we are not able to prepare an invoice to ensure their agreement to the charges and payment before arrival.

- 2. Attrition Policy: Based on the rooming list with only 44 rooms, we will release the other 21 rooms, as per contract. Please note that as of October 6th, we would need to have an additional 52 room reservations with payment.
- 3. Meeting and Banquet arrangements: As per contract, we have blocked the Royal Islander A & B for one full daytime on November 7th, the Maho Room for a Dinner on November 8th and the Upper Pool area for a Welcome Reception on November 6th. These meeting spaces are complimentary; however, Convention Services has not been able to confirm your set-up, audio-visual or Food & Beverage requirements at this time. There is an urgency to receiving this information in order to coordinate preparations and,

ofcourse, to adhere to the signed agreement. Your group is on the all-inclusive plan, which offers a credit to any menus you may choose for these events. For your convenience, I am again attaching our current Banquet menus, pages 20 and 21 reflect the applicable credits.

Additionally, I am attaching a spreadsheet prepared by Convention Services and following receipt of the draft agenda, indicating the events for which spaces have not been reserved. Other members in attendance could give no indication as to where these events would be held. Kindly let us know more specifics as soon as possible. caribnews nov 08 events questions.xls

With regard to the reservations for Mr. and Mrs. Rodney on October 2nd, Marla Chemont had not received the request as of last Thursday.

Due to the high importance of this conference to all parties concerned, I am available to assist and will be involved in ensuring that the Sonesta Maho Beach Resort and Casino successfully comply with the stipulations of the contract and remain in close cooperation with the Government of St. Maarten.

Dear Mr. Stoddard.

The Embassy of Antigua and Barbuda is pleased to refer to telephone conversation (Layne/Stoddard) held last month in which clarification was sought on certain matters pertaining to the Carib News Business Forum, which was held in Antigua and Barbuda during the fall of 2007.

The Embassy is pleased, after consultation with Senator the Hon. Dr. Errol Cort, Minister of National Security, to provide the following answers to the questions posed in the aforementioned telephone conversation.

1. Question:

What is the understanding of Antigua and Barbuda with regards to the US\$31, 500 which was paid to Sandals Hotel?

Answer:

The arrangement between Carib News and the Government of Antigua and Barbuda was that the Government would be responsible for the cost of the rooms for the Members of Congress who attended the Conference. In this regard, Carib News had informed that approximately 25 Members of Congress would attend and, as a consequence, the Government would need to block and pay for 25 rooms. The Government was subsequently advised by Sandals' office in Florida that the cost of the 25 rooms was US\$31, 500. Further, the Government was informed by Sandals that this money had to be paid in advance of the conference and this was done by the Government.

2. Question:

Was it always the Government of Antigua and Barbuda's intention to cover the cost of accommodation for the Members of Congress?

Answer:

It was always the intention of the Government of Antigua and Barbuda to cover the cost of accommodation for the Members of Congress.

3. Question:

Would the Government of Antigua and Barbuda have covered the cost of accommodation if the attendees were not Members of Congress.

Answer:

The Minister is unable to speculate on any actions which the Government would or would not have taken if the attendees were not Members of Congress. The agreement with the Government and Carib News was specific to covering the cost of accommodation for the Members of Congress. They played an integral role in the Conference.

In closing, the Embassy wishes to reiterate the willingness of the Government of Antigua Barbuda to cooperate with the Committee on Standard of Official Conduct in providing any further clarification which may be needed on this matter.
