Payments: Your payment must be sent to the payment address shown on your statement and must be received by 5 p.m. local time at that address to be credited as of the day it is received. Payments we receive after 5 p.m. will not be credited to your Account until the next day. When we process your check electronically, your payment may be withdrawn from your deposit or other asset account as soon as the same day we receive your check, and you will not receive that cancelled check with your financial account statement. If we cannot collect the funds electronically we may issue a draft against your deposit or other asset account for the amount of the check. The method we use to figure the ADB and interest results in daily compounding of interest.

Paying Interest: If you have a Pay Over Time balance, your due date is at least 25 days after the close of each billing period. 

Just 5 want to get some background questions out of the way. 6 7 Son B: Okay. 8 Helen Eisner: How are you currently employed? 9 Son B: I work for the state of Tennessee on the parole board. Helen Eisner: How long have you been working in that position? 10 Since January of last year. Son B: 11 Jeff Brown: What's that position entail? 12 Well, I'm part of a seven member board who votes on cases for Tennessee Son B: 13 Department of Corrections on parole hearings, revocation hearings, executive 14 clemencies, different things like that. 15 Helen Eisner: Okay. Prior to that where were you employed? 16 Son B: I was employed with R.J. Corman Railroad. 17 Helen Eisner: What was your position there? 18 19 Son B: I was a public relations manager. 20 Helen Eisner: Okay. What about for "Duncan for Congress" the campaign committee, your father's campaign committee? Have you held any positions for "Duncan for 21 Congress"? 22 Son B: Well, since I was two years old ... I mean it's all a few hours here, a few hours there. 20 Helen Eisner: Okay. 21 Son B: Different things like that. Helen Eisner: How active was the PAC during your time as treasurer? 22 I mean it was somewhat active you know just as far as trying to raise money and Son B: 23 giving out contributions to other members and different things like that. 24 Helen Eisner: Did you have an employment contract in your role? 25 Son B: I did not. 26 Helen Eisner: You did not, okay. 27 When you took the role over from your brother was there any training or 28 Jeff Brown: onboarding that you took on in order to get familiar with the responsibility of 29 treasurer? 30 Yeah. I've started working with my brother, I don't know, two or three months, 31 Son B: prior to taking it over. 32

Okay. Any formal FEC related trainings? 1 Jeff Brown: Son B: Not at the start, but I did go participate in some FEC trainings in Chicago. 2 Jeff Brown: 3 Okay. Helen Eisner: What about any conversations with the Ethics Committee or any ethics authority 4 when you came on? Do you remember any conversations or discussions with that 5 type of authority? 6 Son B: 7 I do not. Helen Eisner: Okay. What are your current responsibilities for Road to Victory PAC? 8 Right now, so as a board member on the parole board I'm not allowed to have any 9 Son B: outside income so everything I do now is just on a volunteer basis. I assist here 10 and there when Hallie needs it. 11 Helen Eisner: Okay. How often does that happen? 12 Son B: It depends what she needs. We've got two small children so she's pretty busy too. 13 Probably more busy than I am. 14 Helen Eisner: How many hours a month would you say you assist? 15 16 Son B: I mean it would be minimal. Just depending on what she has me like hey, I can't run to the bank today. Can you go run some errands for me? Or, I help her 17 sometimes with the reports if she has any questions. 18 19 Helen Eisner: Why did Hallie take over as treasurer? 20 Son B: Well I mean, once I was appointed I couldn't have the ... It was just a natural progression that way we didn't have to transfer any records or anything, I guess. 21 22 There wasn't any kind of firm discussion about it. She was willing to take it over. Jeff Brown: Who were those discussions with? 23 Son B: What do you mean? How so? 24 25 Jeff Brown: About transferring to Hallie. Was that conversation with you and her? Was that conversation with you and your father? 26 Son B: Both. 27 28 Helen Eisner: What was the conversation you had with your father? Son B: Trying to think back. I can't really do this anymore, so we need to figure out 29 something else. That's really the basic gist of it. I don't remember every detail of a 30 conversations we had about it but that's the basic gist of it. 31 Helen Eisner: Sure. Whose idea was it for Hallie to take over? 32

Did Haley's background in 7 FEC treasurer work or in accounting come up in those conversations? 8 Not specifically about FEC background or anything like that, but we discussed 9 Son B: whether she was capable of doing the work. We both came to the agreement that 10 she was. 11 Helen Eisner: Okay. 12 Jeff Brown: Was there any onboarding process for when she took over the role? 13 Son B: Similar to what I did. She mirrored me there towards the end. I also there again, 14 assisted after she started on, especially since the PAC's sort of winding down, it's 15 not as an intensive process as it say it was, used to be. 16 Helen Eisner: I want to show you a document. This is RTV 0298. Those are bates numbers. It's 17 just so we can keep track of things for the transcript. This is what looks like a 18 Hilliard Lyons account statement. 19 Mm-hmm (affirmative). Son B: 20 Helen Eisner: Do you know what the Hilliard Lyons account is for the PAC? 21 22 Son B: Yes. Helen Eisner: And what is it? 23 24 Son B: It was an investment account. Helen Eisner: Okay, and when you say "was" ... Did that change? 25 We've recently divested. 26 Son B: Helen Eisner: Okay. 27 28 Son B: Or the PAC's recently divested out of that as of my Dad winding down. Helen Eisner: Who made that decision to divest? 29 There again, it was my Dad said to sell the stock ... general conversations between 30 Son B: 31 us all. Helen Eisner: And who did he say that to? 32

Helen Eisner: And then the divest-10 11 Son B: Oh, the divesting, okay, sorry, would have been more towards, I guess the beg ... I don't really have a specific date, I really don't. It would have been within the last 12 year or so. 13 Helen Eisner: So it was in 2017? 14 15 Son B: Yes, I think so. Helen Eisner: Was that before or after your father made a public announcement that he would 16 17 not be seeking re-election? Son B: I mean, it's been an ongoing conversation for ... His retiring is what I'm talking 18 about. It's been an ongoing conversation for the last, basically two years, and 19 20 there'd been some general discussions of when we start winding down what does the account look like? Is it making money, is it doing things like that. So, to really 21 pinpoint a specific ... Helen Eisner: This document that we've provided, the Hilliard Lyons account, so at the tables at 21 the top of it, you're listed as "Attention: Son B". Were you the authorized owner 22 of the account? Or, what was your role of the account? 23 24 Son B: Yeah, I mean-Helen Eisner: The contact? 25 The contact. 26 Son B: Helen Eisner: And below that, is that your home address? 27 28 Son B: It is. Helen Eisner: Why were you the contact for the account? 29 Son B: Because I'm the one that set it up. We hadn't changed it. 30 Helen Eisner: Were there discussions of changing the contact for the account? 31 32 Son B: No, not really.

- 1 Helen Eisner: When you receive these statements, would you receive them through the mail?
- 2 Son B: Yes.
- 3 Helen Eisner: And what would happen with the statements?
- 4 Son B: They would go into the filing cabinet.
- 5 Helen Eisner: Who would put them in the filing cabinet?
- 6 Son B: Either Hallie or myself, either one.
- 7 Helen Eisner: And what was the Congressman's knowledge of these statements?
- 8 Son B: Very little. He didn't ... It wasn't a regular check or anything like that.
- 9 Helen Eisner: What is his knowledge of the PAC's finances in general?
- 10 Son B: Just a general knowledge, very little, I guess. I don't think he has it down to the
- cents or anything.
- Helen Eisner: How aware is he of disbursements or payments that are coming from the PAC
- 13 account?
- 14 Son B: As far as, you mean, what just the salary? Or the-
- Helen Eisner: Salary or any disbursements that the PAC makes for bills or to other campaigns.
- Son B: As far as contributions or anything goes, nothing goes out without his direction.
- Helen Eisner: What about disbursements other than contributions?
- 18 Son B: He's aware of those.
- 19 Helen Eisner: And how does he become aware of them?
- 20 Son B: Depending on what it is or when it was, I or Hallie would talk to him about it.
- 21 Jeff Brown: And aside from contributions and salaries, what other sorts of disbursements
- 22 might you be referring to?
- 23 Son B: Tax payments.
- 24 Jeff Brown: Anything else?
- 25 Son B: Salaries, contributions, tax payments, reimbursement for electronics, computer
- 26 equipment, different things like that.
- 27 Helen Eisner: And what tax payments does the PAC make?
- 28 Son B: It's just all off the investment account.
- 29 Helen Eisner: I want to show you another document, which is RTV-

You need this one back? 1 Son B: 2 Helen Eisner: Yeah, we'll take it back, thanks. RTV 0017 through 0018. This is an email from August 19, 2017. Son B: It is. 5 Helen Eisner: And are you familiar with what this email statement is? 6 7 Son B: Yeah, it's the receipt. Helen Eisner: Receipt from? 8 9 Son B: The FEC for filing. Helen Eisner: The FEC for filing. 10 11 Son B: Yeah. 12 Helen Eisner: So, this is August 2017, it's fairly recent. Why was your email address used for this type of filing email? 13 Son B: I'm the backup. 14 Helen Eisner: You're the backup... 15 Son B: The backup email. 16 Helen Eisner: What is the primary email that is used? 17 Son B: I think it's 18 Helen Eisner: Who checks that email account? 19 20 Son B: It's either Hallie or myself. Helen Eisner: Why wasn't that email used for the FEC filing? 21 22 Son B: It is. I am just the secondary, back-up. Helen Eisner: So you received this, but this would have also gone to the other email account? 23 24 Son B: Yes. Helen Eisner: So you maintain yourself, your personal email address as the back-up after you 25 left the role as treasurer? And why did you do that? Why wasn't it switched to 26 another email address? 27 Son B: There's no reason. When we switched it over...put in a secondary email. I was 28 switching it over, that's what I did. 29

Helen Eisner: When you say switched it over, when did that occur?

Helen Eisner: Are they all FEC emails or do you receive other emails? 8 9 Son B: Majority of them...there are some solicitations, I guess. Helen Eisner: For contributions? 10 11 Son B: No, services. 12 Helen Eisner: I want to move on to a slightly different topic. I will provide you this form, which is an FEC form, miscellaneous text FEC form 99 filed on June 19, 2015. I'll give 13 you a moment to familiarize yourself with the document. All this appears to 14 relate to what is described toward the bottom of the document, the \$37,727 15 variance. What can you tell us about that variance? 16 17 Son B: It was part of cash correction that we had an accounting firm do sort of an audit to check and see why there was that variance in the accounts at the time and through 18 that we wanted to make sure there wasn't anything that had gone missing or 19 anything like that. 20 Helen Eisner: And why did the variance occur? 21 22 Son B: I don't have a specific knowledge of why it occurred, but it had occurred and so we wanted to remedy the situation as best we could and as quickly as possible 23 24 with the FEC. 25 Helen Eisner: Do you have a general knowledge of why it occurred? Son B: Well there was part of it was some contributions were reported, but not received 26 and some contributions, I think, were...some disbursements, I think, were 27 reported, but not...or done, but not reported. 28 Helen Eisner: What were those disbursements? 29 30 Son B: I don't have...without having to go through all the stuff, I don't have anything specific. 31 Helen Eisner: Do you know who made those disbursements? 32 33 Son B: That was prior to my time and I don't know who made them.

- 1 Helen Eisner: When did you first learn of the variance?
- 2 Son B: Probably would have been the first part of 2012, I believe.
- 3 Helen Eisner: What did you do at that point, when you learned that the variance existed?
- 4 Son B: We started the process of getting an audit and getting things going.
- 5 Helen Eisner: Getting an audit, what was that process?
- 6 Son B: Contacted a local accounting firm that our family has done business with and
- 7 asked them to take an independent look at it.
- 8 Helen Eisner: Which accounting firm is that?
- 9 Son B: Rodefer Moss.
- 10 Helen Eisner: Who is your contact there?
- 11 Son B: I had two different contacts. Originally, it was a man by the name of Demetrius
- Demas or Demos and he started the audit. I don't specifically know why, but he
- left the firm, so then Mr. Rodefer took it over.
- 14 Helen Eisner: Who is is it Jimmy Rodefer?
- 15 Son B: Jimmy Rodefer, yes ma'am.
- 16 Helen Eisner: Who is Jimmy Rodefer?
- 17 Son B: He is the Rodefer in Rodefer Moss.
- Helen Eisner: How long have you known Mr. Rodefer?
- 19 Son B: Ten or more years.
- 20 Helen Eisner: Is that all through accounting related work?
- 21 Son B: Yes, accounting and political.
- Helen Eisner: What type of political work does he do?
- 23 Son B: He was the treasurer for my brother's...really it's all accounting work.
- Helen Eisner: Does he have any type of personal relationship with your family?
- 25 Son B: Yeah, they're friends.
- 26 Helen Eisner: Do they socialize?
- 27 Son B: Yeah.
- 28 Helen Eisner: This document, the text here, who wrote this text?
- 29 Son B: Heidi and I worked on it together.

1 Helen Eisner: Did anyone else work on it? 2 Son B: In theory, Rodefer Moss would have provided information to include in the text, 3 but the actual writing of the narrative was worked on between her and I. Helen Eisner: What about the Congressman, was he involved in the text? 4 Son B: Not specifically this, I don't believe. 5 Helen Eisner: Would he have reviewed it before it was filed? 6 I can't remember specifically an official review to the best of my knowledge. 7 Son B: Helen Eisner: What was his role in the audit that was conducted? Was he aware... 8 9 Son B: He was. Helen Eisner: What discussions did you have with him about reporting the information from the 10 audit to the FEC? 11 12 Son B: We just talked about what...during the process and that we needed to make it 13 right. 14 Helen Eisner: Besides this particular information, the text here, what else was submitted to the 15 Son B: That was, as far as I know, and I know that Heidi went over and had 16 conversations with the FEC. But as far as anything that we submitted, this was the 17 only document that was submitted. 18 19 Helen Eisner: When did you first, well let me ask it this way, did the FEC first contact you 20 about the variance? 21 Son B: This was self-reported. Helen Eisner: Self-reported. And when did you first contact them about the variance? 22 23 Son B: I can't remember. Helen Eisner: So this was filed June 2015. Was it in 2015? 24 Son B: I can't remember. 25 26 Helen Eisner: Did you have conversations with the FEC? 27 Son B: I don't believe I had specific conversations with them. I'm trying to remember back, now. I did have some conversations with them, and our analysts, and I'm 28 trying to remember. I believe I may have had some conversations, but I can't 29 specifically recall an actual conversation that was specifically in relation to this 30 correction. 31

3	Son B:	I'd say so.	
4	Helen Eisner:	So approximately a year?	
5	Son B:	There again, I can't specifically remember.	
6	Helen Eisner:	What did the FEC ask you to provide, or ask the PAC to provide?	
7	Son B:	This form, and as best we could on the numbers.	
8	Helen Eisner:	Did they ask you to provide this itemization at the bottom, this section here?	
9	Son B:	Yes.	
10 11 12 13	Helen Eisner:	At the top of the form it says, "During an external audit completed during the first half of 2015, an outside certified public accounting firm discovered a variance." Earlier you said that you thought that you first learned of the variance in approximately 2012?	
14	Son B:	Yes.	
15 16 17	Helen Eisner:	What did you learn in 2012, versus what's described here, that an external audit was completed in 2015, the first half, and that a public accounting firm discovered the variance?	
18 19 20 21	Son B:	There wouldn't be anything different. I guess the wording should have been different on that, but the audit was completed during the first half of 2015. I guess we should have said we started the audit prior to that, I guess, or it wasn't specifically discovered by them.	
22 23 24	Helen Eisner:	Why did it take approximately three years between 2012 and 2015 to report? You said it's possible you had conversations with the FEC before this filing, but to report to the FEC about the variance?	
25 26 27 28	Son B:	Well, there again, we had one accountant who started the audit and there again, I can't speak to why he left the firm, but he obviously didn't complete it and so then we had to have it taken over. Technically, I guess, it was looked over twice, internally there.	
29 30	Helen Eisner:	So between the two different accountants, it just took a long time to complete the audit?	
31	Son B:	It did.	
32 33 34	Helen Eisner:	This is RTV_0282 through 0283. Give you a chance to take a look at these. So this looks like it's in draft form. This looks like it's a report from Rodefer Moss. What happened to the final version of this?	

1	Son B:	There wasn't anything. It never became a final copy.	
2	Helen Eisner:	And why not?	
3 4	Son B:	We just went through the process with the FEC and it wasn't anything that was needed, I guess, or necessary.	
5 6	Helen Eisner:	So this was prepared in case it needed to be submitted, and correct me if I'm wrong, but it was never submitted to the FEC?	
7	Son B:	I do not believe it was.	
8 9	Helen Eisner:	So what was the goal of producing this report? What was the reason for the report?	
10	Son B:	It was just something that I guess Rodefer Moss put together.	
11	Helen Eisner:	And who was involved in crafting this language in this report?	
12	Son B:	It would have been Rodefer Moss.	
13 14	Helen Eisner:	Who made the decision to use the timeframes that are described here starting in 2009?	
15	Son B:	I can't specifically recall.	
16 17	Helen Eisner:	Do you recall any conversations about what timeframe to use, as far as reporting to the FEC?	
18 19	Son B:	Well, yeah, when we started it, it was Rodefer Moss pulled up FEC policy on how far back to report. And so that was the determination. It was three years, I believe.	
20	Helen Eisner:	It was how many years?	
21	Son B:	I believe it was three years.	
22	Helen Eisner:	Three years.	
23	Son B:	Three years from the date.	
24	Helen Eisner:	Just going to show you a few more documents.	
25 26	Son B:	Because we were in 2012 or 2013 at that point. And also, the bank statements were kept online at that point, and they only went back a certain amount of time.	
27	Helen Eisner:	So they would have gone back prior to 2009?	
28 29 30	Son B:	I believe they would have. And that's how some of the information was discovered, but like I said, it was Rodefer Moss looked through the FEC rules and regulations.

1 Helen Eisner: Let me show you this document, RTV 0223 is actually what I'm going to show you. This is an email from May 29th, 2015. I believe this is between you and 2 Jimmy Rodefer? 3 Son B: Uh-huh. 4 Helen Eisner: So the first sentence there says, "The FEC has asked that when we report that we 5 do a mass reporting, so we need to get a total missed receipts and total missed 6 7 disbursements that would zero out the discrepancy?" Son B: Uh-huh. 8 9 Helen Eisner: Was that a direct conversation you had had with the FEC? Son B: No. 10 Helen Eisner: And who would have had that conversation? 11 Son B: I believe Heidi. 12 Helen Eisner: So what does it mean to provide a mass reporting? 13 Son B: Just the number, the total number. 14 Helen Eisner: A few more documents, just following up on that. Some charts of these were 15 provided by the PAC. This is RTV 0005 through 0006, also RTV 0007 through 16 0008. Bear with me, I've got a bunch of stuff here. These are some charts that 17 were provided to us. I'll provide the second one too. Are you familiar with that 18 document? 19 Son B: 20 I am. Helen Eisner: Who created that document? 21 22 Son B: Somebody at Rodefer Moss. Helen Eisner: Were any of these charts, which were originally Excel spreadsheets ... this is just 23 there ... copy form here provided to the FEC? 24 25 Son B: Not to my knowledge. Helen Eisner: What about this document: RTV 0010 through 0013? At the top of the document 26 it says detail variances between FEC report and bank account activities? Who 27 created this document? 28 Son B: There again, that would have been ... Rodefer Moss. I can't specifically-29 Helen Eisner: And how was this document generated? 30 This would have been the start of the audit or because of the audit. 31 Son B: Helen Eisner: And was this document provided to the FEC? 32

1	Son B:	Not to my knowledge.
2 3 4 5 6	Helen Eisner:	So, at the going back I'm sorry, I've just handed you a lot of paper, but looking at the miscellaneous text to the F.E.C., this June 19, 2015 filing I see that there's certain contributions that are itemized below there, about three of them. Why were those the only three that were itemized in the miscellaneous tax to the FEC?
7 8	Son B:	Those were specifically were referenced because they were actually reported as income received, and that's why they were on there.
9	Helen Eisner:	So that's why those were on there?
10 11	Son B:	Mm-hmm (affirmative)-So those were reported as contributions to the FEC, but weren't ever received.
12 13	Helen Eisner:	The description right above this itemization says a cash on hand adjustment on the June 20th monthly report I'm sorry I'll let you get to that-
14	Son B:	Sorry, I'm trying to find it.
15 16 17 18 19	Helen Eisner:	Let's see. Yeah, you got it. It's being made to correct the variance, due the age of some of the unreported transactions, the PAC, not provide itemization for all of them. When this text was written, had you seen this document, which is the 0010 through 0013, the report of variances, or detailed variances between FEC report and bank account activities?
20 21 22 23	Son B:	I can't specifically remember if I had seen it at that point or not. I know that at the end of the day, we had a file that had been put together, and we kept the file because of the audit, and this was in that file. I can't specifically remember These documents are what I remember specifically about the variances.
24 25	Helen Eisner:	So, these three at the bottom, where would that information have come from. Was that from the accounting report?
26	Son B:	Yes.
27 28 29 30 31 32 33	Helen Eisner:	I guess I'm just trying to understand There's a lot of detail here in this document, detailed variances, and it seems that Rodefer Moss conducted a very thorough accounting of transactions that eventually added up to this \$37,000 amount, but there were a high number of disbursements over a long period of time and a high number of receipts over a long period of time. It looks like there's a lot of detail about the specific transactions. If you can help me understand why these three were the only itemized transactions reported to the F.E.C.
34 35	Son B:	Like I said those were the ones that we were I was specifically aware of at that time.
36	Helen Eisner:	Would Rodefer Moss have been aware of these at the time of this filing?

1	Son B:	I can't speak to what they were or were not aware of.
2	Jeff Brown:	Was Rodefer Moss involved in this miscellaneous text document in any way?
3	Son B:	Well, we would have gotten the numbers from them.
4	Jeff Brown:	Would they have reviewed this document before it was submitted?
5	Son B:	I can't specifically remember if they did or not.
6 7	Jeff Brown:	Do you recall if Rodefer Moss produced some sort of report in final form about the variance?
8 9	Son B:	I don't believe so. I mean there wasn't an official final report. It was all done through communications.
10 11 12	Jeff Brown:	And these three different documents that we've been looking at, the ones that start, RTV_0010, RTV_0007, RTV_0005. Those are all documents that would have come from Rodefer Moss as part of the conversations about the variance?
13 14	Son B:	Yeah, everything that's generated through, as far as the variances, came from Rodefer Moss.
