In accordance with Rule 18(e)(2) of the Committee on Ethics (Committee) and Rule XI, clause 3(b)(9) of the Rules of the House of Representatives, the Committee hereby submits the following Report to the House of Representatives:

I. FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

On December 10, 2024, the Committee convened for the purpose of considering the November 21, 2024, misdemeanor charge filed against Representative Michael McCaul, for public intoxication at Washington Dulles International Airport in Virginia (Dulles). The charges were filed in Loudoun County General District Court after Representative McCaul was cited for his conduct while at Dulles earlier in November. Representative McCaul informed the Committee the prosecutor determined to dismiss the matter. On December 13, 2024, the charge was voluntarily dismissed.

The Committee voted against impaneling an investigative subcommittee in this matter. The Committee considered the scope and nature of the conduct described above and determined that review by an investigative subcommittee is not required.

The Committee has determined to take no further action in this matter, and upon publication of this Report, considers the matter closed.
